2020 Health Programs: Linked over 175 people to a specific Health & Support Services such as:

PrEP Services- We assess PrEP eligibility for interested clients, link them to HIV testing, & provide assistance with medication, care provider access, & on-going adherence

Mental Health Pride (MHP) - Cover therapy sessions for LGBTQ+ youth who are

HIV Linkage to Care - Provide access to free HIV testing & linkage to resources & services related to HIV care.



Beyond the Binary- Provide Trans-specific counseling to assist clients with accessing hormone replacement therapy (HRT), gender re-affirming surgery, name & gender marker change, connection to legal assistance, & community health advocacy. SAGE – Our social networking group for LGBTQ+ people 50+ years of age provides

2020 YouthConnect Program:

We served over 260 youth virtually this year! YouthConnect is an engaging group for LGBTQ youth/young adults (13-24)offering events, empowerment workshops, job development assistance, tutoring, meals, a social support group, HIV/STD testing & prevention, mental health referrals & so much more!

Tracy is an LGBTQ+ identifying youth who reached out to HPC to participate in our fun/social LGBTQ+ youth events. Tracy had never been a part of an LGBTQ+ safe space before & while her parents were supportive of her, she hadn't experienced being able

to connect with other LGBTQ+ youth like her. After attending her first virtual meeting with YouthConnect, she has become more engaged and has been welcomed by everyone in our safe space. Tracy shared feeling like there is a space where she can "belong" and continues to personally grow and find her voice.

Jadyn is a Trans identifying LGBTQ+ youth whose been a part of YouthConnect for over 2 years. During quarantine, HPC Staff provided emotional & re-affirming support virtually to him. Jadyn was physically isolated from his safe-space community & experienced feeling (emotionally, mentally & spiritually) alone during a time where he couldn't leave his house. Jadyn attends our weekly virtual LGBTQ+ support group meetings & our team has connected him with food deliveries to his house every week, as he was also facing food insecurity during this time. He continues to attend our

LGBTQ+ youth support group meetings and has also become a strong support system for other peers who look up to him and the ways in which he cares for our community.

PrEP Counseling I appreciate you asking me how I am doing, being in the U.S. for over 3 years I have yet to find someone to ask me that. It means a lot that someone out there still cares, especially from someone who I have yet to meet in person. - D.P., 34 / Male / Bisexual

Thank you for all of your help and for doing what you can to help our community the way you were able to help me. - A.S., 31/Male/Gay

Over the course of my summer 2020 I became HIV positive. Prior to receiving healthcare I have now I used to do checkups at urgent care clinics. I am incredibly Thankful to my provider Joseph Zapata. At a time of uncertainty his name came to mind. Being someone who would always stay on top of health and appearance this was life changing for me. My sense of pride changed in the most humbling

way. The pandemic flipped my life upside down in ways for better and worse but altogether thankful. I couldn't be more thankful to the people at Hudson Pride Center and the Ryan white program health care center because they placed the power to control my life back in my hands. Prior to receiving this healthcare and

becoming positive I tried to get state insurance to get myself on Prep. The time frame was not in my favor because my submission was delayed and the amount of money received from unemployment was not enough to handle bills and pay for medication out of pocket. I can't tell you how incredibly grateful I am for the

care and support I receive now. Thank you for saving my life, for saving the lives of others and reminding each and every one of us under the program how valuable our life and health is. - Anonymous, 30/ Cisgender Male / Gay

Under my doctor's advice and medical conditions, I need to take the utmost caution to isolate myself at home to avoid catching the Covid-19 virus. Hudson Pride Center sponsoring Zoom events, such as the two SAGE meetings every week, has been a lifeline for me to stay engaged with others in both a social and educational environment. I come out of these remote meetings feeling renewed, recharged, and happy.
